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2007 ANNUAL REPORT OF ASODI

It was a very remarkable year in the life of ASODI in that she registered a lot of Successes. Most of all what had been earmarked in her previous year's plan of Action and not accomplish were implemented this year. Though challenging the year was, ASODI made successes in sending/sponsoring 57 Orphans in Ngie at African Pioneer College Teze Ngie- Momo Division, North West Province. 16 Orphans will be completing tailoring training drawn from all the 19 villages of Ngie under ASODI'S Sponsorship, 4 orphans currently taking carpentry, 4 others training in Hairdressing and 16 of the Orphans in the upper villages of Ngie undergoing Goat Rearing for their lives.

In the area of income generating activity, ASODI has been carrying out the buying and selling of Palm oil, thanks to her partnership with the Catholic Relieve Services, Yaounde Cameroon who financed them with 400,000frs. Meanwhile, she registered a renounced success in Epilepsy Management as she expanded the free Phenobarbital giving exercise to other 3 Sub Divisions in Momo Division, namely Njikwa, Mbengwi Central and Widikum Covering more than 700 Epilepsy Patients.

Many thanks to our Volunteers who are spread out in all these areas as they do the Phenobarbital distribution for us.

The long awaited Biomedical research in Epilepsy was launched as a lot of ground work has been done for it to be implemented this 2008. God is so great and kind to us, as early this same year the Ministry of Public Health sent Dr. kuotong Rogers a Public Health Doctor to come and take statistics from us so that the Ministry should know what we are doing and assist us though we are still waiting for this to happen.

The year ended with ASODI receiving a letter of Encouragement /Congratulation from the Honourable Minister of Social Affairs Cameroon for the work she is doing to vulnerable persons in the area of assistance.

Serious sensitization work was done to guardians, Epilepsy patients in Ngie by Irene Elliott and Mary Douglas with Ambanibe Jerome all neurologic nurses on the launching of the Epilepsy Biomedical Research in Ngie. It was indeed a blessed year to ASODI.

Continuous assistance was given to over 1200 orphans in Primary Schools in Ngie in the area of school materials like books, Uniforms, food all round the year and foster parenting with need assessment continue to be the watch words in carrying out our activities not forgetting the bottom- top approach in all our projects.

Nevertheless, this work would not have been successful if some people did not join hands, we begin with the Christians of St. John's Presbyterian Church USA who are

doing a lot to assist us financially, the Catholic Relieve Servicesour parteners in Yaounde, the hardworking and tireless coordinators of ASODI in Momo Division..

The sick kids hospital/university of Toronto in Canada, the Provincial Delegate of Social Affairs North West , the Divisional Delegate of Social Affairs Momo and Staff, the Chief of Brigade control North West just to name a few. May God reward them all.

We also like to thank the District Medical Officer for Mbengwi Dr. Ajabmoh Henry for his relentless support and collaboration. May God reward him abundantly.

In addition, the Religious and Traditional authorities of Ngie together with the administration make us proud as they are always behind us.

Meanwhile, the foster parents/guardians of Epilepsy patients are a force for us to reckon with.

We will end here by thanking Professor Njamnshi Alfred who is currently going through our file at the Ministry of Public Health Yaounde Cameroon, that for the short time we have worked with him, we admire and cherish his fatherly support. We beg God to cement our relationship/ partnership with his Ministry so that together we can help the needy in Cameroon and make them independent and proud people.
